## PART [A] - THE PRODUCT PLAN

### **Hypothesis/ Question :**

**“In Australia the issue of homelessness is becoming more of a problem. Is there sufficient community support? Is homelessness more prevalent in metropolitan areas of Australia?”**

The topic chosen to research is the ‘Homeless’, this topic was chosen because it is interesting and surprising how children, young teenagers, adults and the elderly that struggle in this situation and somehow find a way to survive.

Homelessness is a difficult term to define as people disagree on who to include as homeless. Homeless is defined as “someone without a conventional home and who lacks most of the economic and social support that a home normally affords.” The homeless are often cut off from support of relatives and friends, have few independent resources and often have no immediate means of self support. Basically they have inadequate access to safe and secure housing. There are different degrees of homeless, some live in the street or access crisis refuge accommodation which is temporary etc.

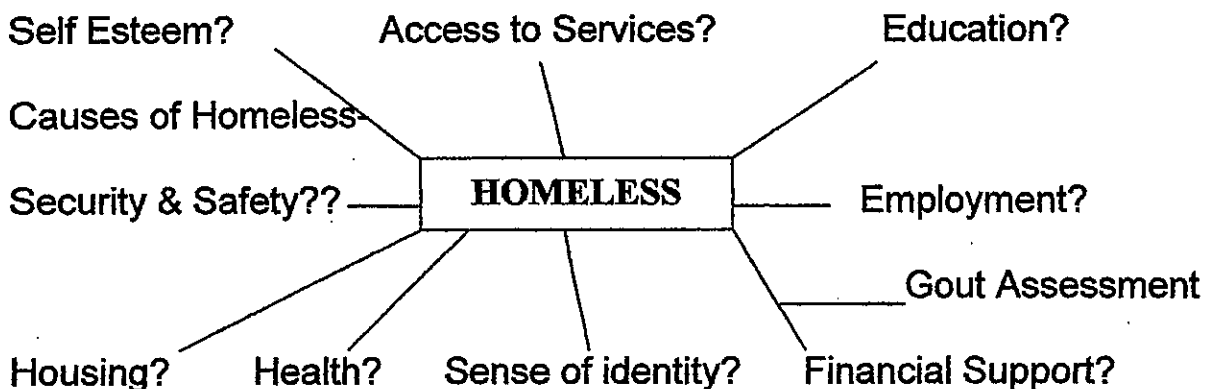
“Homelessness on the increase” is a growing concern in Australia as the statistics are rising. In my Research project I will: identify the main problems and implications for the health of homeless; I will discuss the government funding and support networks available for the homeless; people in our communities can contribute to prevent and put a stop to children, teenagers, adults and the elderly being homeless.

The Focus topic “The Homeless” relates to the selected Course Content Area ‘Groups in Context; the homeless’ and can also be linked to the option ‘Individuals and work; individual and group needs meet through work’. Also the Core; ‘Parenting and Caring’ relates to some aspects and reasons for homelessness.

A number of research methods will be utilised to both primary and secondary information. It will aim to distribute primary research methods such as surveys, interviews and questionnaires to a variety

of students (different ages) at different schools, parents, teachers and different employees at different support networks for the homeless. The research will also include an observation of the percentages of homeless people in metropolitan areas compared to country regions using secondary research methods (internet; websites such as ABS) other secondary resources such as; articles, video's will be expected to use to provide background information on homeless, which can later be applied to the results which have been gained through extensive research.

There will be newspaper articles collected to reflect the effect of homelessness on communities and general public from the Sydney Morning Herald, Sydney Telegraph and Parkes champion post.

The factual information found for the research topic at the corresponding web sites and from any other secondary sources will help act as a guideline for the research product, providing previous findings and statistics, which can be included in questionnaires and interviews.

For this Research project it is important to address ethical guidelines to ensure integrity of both the data and researcher is followed through. It is necessary to be constantly aware of personal views, and take all precautions to prevent bias in results. In order to follow ethical guidelines, questionnaires, interviews and surveys should be created so that people can answer themselves, without the researchers personal views or opinions being forced onto participants. To achieve 'integrity of data' questions should stay simple, un-influenced way (not embiguous), leading to the participants own personal views, thoughts and opinions being expressed.

To ensure that primary sources handed out are ethical and appropriate, the questions will be worded carefully with consideration and surveys will be proof. By doing this, it ensures that questions will not be offensive to any people, and to ensure that the privacy of any individual has not been breached.

This IRP aims to conduct the main body of my research over eight weeks, then two weeks analysing the data, which I will have gathered, recording my results of the research and then writing my final report.

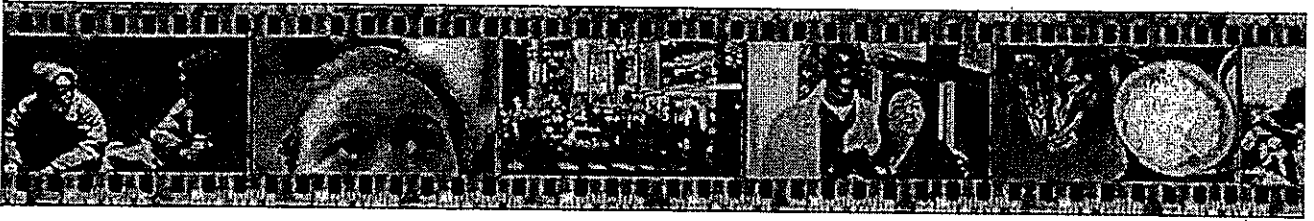
\* Project Diary

# Abstract. KJK

Over a period of ten weeks between 22<sup>nd</sup> December<sup>2007</sup> and roughly to March 2008, a variety of research has been conducted in order to attempt to gain an insight into ~~how~~ ~~School Centers~~ are homelessness and what people in the general public think about it.

The aim of conducting research into this topic was to gain an insight into how the community, especially students and parents felt about homeless people and would they help if they could.

Using surveys, questionnaires and interviews, a range of parents, students and teachers throughout parker have been questioned as to their feelings about homelessness and the government guidelines. In all, 20 surveys were handed out to random students between year two and twelve, with a 100% return rate, 20 surveys were handed out to random parents with a 50% return rate, and 20 questionnaires were handed out to different ~~businesses~~ people in parker district with 40% return rate. Both qualitative and quantitative research was used in order for a range of valid results to be collected, and to vary the kinds of results presented.

After conducting various forms of primary research, it is recommended that, in order to uncover more reliable and varied information and results, a much larger sample size should be undertaken. This should include the questioning of people outside the Parker region, along with a wider range of members of the community - including local members of parliament and homelessness support network.

The following reports includes the details of the information discovered throughout this extensive research task, including the result and conclusions formed after processing the data received.

# \* Introduction \*

The topic "In Australia the issue of homelessness is becoming more of a problem. Is their sufficient community support? Is homelessness more prevalent in metropolitan areas of Australia." was chosen as I have a genuine interest in ~~the~~ homelessness and their lifestyles. In light of these factors, I am very concerned with the growing number of ~~over~~ homeless human beings, children, teenagers and adults in our current society. Is there enough or sufficient community support? It is for these reasons that I wished to investigate what actions the government is taking on to prevent the increase of homelessness. I also wish to discover the reactions of society in relation to the assistance that the Government is providing, and if people feel these actions are enough or if more <sup>support</sup> ~~elastic~~ measures need to be implemented.

While conducting this research, it was necessary to be constantly aware of personal views, and to ensure that these views were not forced onto other people through the wording in the surveys and questionnaires distributed. It was ensured that no predetermined views were implemented in the primary research methodologies distributed, nor was the language offensive or unethical in any way. To ensure research methods were ethical and non bias, all questionnaires, interviews, and surveys were piloted with an number of senior people, including teachers and parents, all of whom provided feedback on any risqué topics.

Privacy was also an issue that had to be dealt with to ensure participants felt comfortable with completing surveys. To ensure all ethical requirements were met, participants were treated with respect and integrity, with all documents remaining confidential and anonymous.

There were limitations encountered with conducting research within only the <sup>Parkes</sup> ~~state~~ region. Due to restriction of time & resources.

## Literature Review

homelessness, especially child homelessness is a growing concern, not only in Australia but throughout the world. Australian homeless statistics, 99,900 homeless people in Australia, 54% adults over 24yrs of age, 10% under the age of 12, 36% young people between 12-24 years, 42% of homeless people were female, 58% were single, 19% were couples, 23% were families.

On the census night - homeless people were considered by census to be homeless were staying in services funded through the supported Accommodation Assistance program. they provide fund for crisis services to homeless people around the country.

There are many causes of homelessness for example: lack of affordable housing, low paying jobs, substance abuse and lack of needed services, mental illness and lack of needed services, domestic violence, unemployment, poverty, prison release, change cuts in public assistance.

Domestic violence is of the most common reasons for women and their children becoming homeless.

Homelessness is a dynamic state, children are homeless on average 10 months at a time. 25% of homeless children are homeless more than once. Hospitalization is common for homeless children

Health is a big problem in homeless situations and infectious diseases. homeless families often live in crowded quarters, which increases the risk of the common infectious disease of childhood such as upper respiratory infections, ear infections, and diarrhea.
