Answer may include:

- Privacy, anonymity, confidentiality and respect are important.
- Consulting the preschool and gaining permission from the preschool to conduct the observations.
- Getting signed permission from parents/caregivers to observe their children.
- Informing the parents/caregivers of the nature of the study.
- If permission is not given, then the child cannot be part of the research.
- Give the parent/caregiver the opportunity to view the final report and its findings.
- Using numbers, letters or changing names to protect the identity of the subjects.
- Ensuring the safety and welfare of the participants.
- Maintaining integrity by being honest and reporting truthfully, objectively and without bias.
- Careful storage of data.
- Not revealing data collected to others.
